



Bring a small towel to dry the dew off your bike each morning and glass cleaner to keep your windshield free of bugs and road grime, and don't forget your rain suit and sunscreen.

larger, busting at the seams with things to do and see, turkey legs and



beer, bands and bike shows, races and charity rides and a mammoth cottage industry of doo dads, bling and performance upgrades to make our bikes look cooler or run faster. (the only reason to f%&^ with a stock bike in my humble opinion) But the underlying reason has always been for the love of motorcycles and freedom. We all have that in common and that's what I'll be thinking

about this rally season; the things we have in common and how fortunate we are to have them.


and we think of how we'll ride down to its shore and as I sit at its edge ... drink cool coffee from a canteen ... while I watch her wade in the water up to her knees

100th Annual Loudon Classic Headlines Motorcycle Week at NHMS

ew Hampshire Motor Speedway is a must-stop destination with racing, camping, demo rides and entertainment for riders during Laconia Motorcycle Week.

LOUDON, NH – New Hampshire Motor Speedway (NHMS) is a top destination for riders during Laconia Motorcycle Week, June 10-18, with on- and off-track events throughout nine days of motorcycle mayhem. The 100th Annual Loudon Classic headlines a week-long motorcycle celebration that also features vendors, demo rides, camping and more.

"We're thrilled to be a part of this century-long tradition in New Hampshire," said NHMS Executive Vice President and General Manager David McGrath. "We can't wait to welcome thousands of riders from all over the country to NHMS as they roar in to New Hampshire. We'll have lots of thrilling racing on the road course, highlighted by the 100th Annual Loudon Classic with an incredible purse this year, as well as a new motorcycle skills competition, a variety of vendors, charity rides, demo rides and more."

NHMS is home to the best racing action in the region, and there will be no shortage of action on the 1.6-mile full road course with nearly 50 races throughout five days. The US Classic Racing Association kicks it off with the FIM North American Vintage Championships, June 10-11.

The racing continues June 16-18 when Northeast Motorcycle Road Racing (NEMRR) competes in round three of Championship Cup Series racing, highlighted by the 100th Annual Loudon Classic Middleweight Grand Prix, which has been held on site since long before the speedway was built, when it was simply a road course named Bryar Motorsports Park. Known as the longest-running motorcycle race in America, this year's Classic features a \$250,000 purse with a \$55,000 prize for first place making it the richest motorcycle road race in US history.

Penguin Road Racing School will host instructional sessions for riders looking to improve their skills June 14-15.

Katancha and Harley-Davidson will host the largest demo ride course in the area along with a vendor mall and food court June 10-17. The nearly nine-mile route will take riders through and on- and off-property experience to test out the latest and greatest that the top motorcycle manufacturers in the world, such as Harley-Davidson, have to offer. Members of Harley Owners Group, the official riding club of Harley-Davidson, can pick up their commemorative rally pin. On top of the demo rides, there will be a plethora of vendors on site with gear, accessories, sound systems and more for bikers.



Support children in need throughout New England in two events that benefits the NH Chapter of Speedway Children's Charities (SCCNH), the official charity of NHMS. New this year, ProRider 603 will set up a timed motorcycle skills challenge named Top Cop for Kids Motorcycle Skills Challenge at NHMS June 10-11 for regional police officers as well as non-police riders. There will also be a fun course set up for any licensed motorcycle rider to test their skills and earn bragging rights among their fellow riders. Registration is \$50 per police or civilian rider taking part in the timed challenge and \$10 per rider for the fun course. Register at SpeedwayCharities.org.

Ride to the Racetrack cruise from Laconia Harley-Davidson to NHMS is on June 13 and includes two laps on the 1.6-mile full road course. Registration is \$20 per rider or passenger, and all proceeds benefit SCCNH.

With the speedway centrally-located on Route 106, the main corridor to Laconia and just 20 minutes south of Rally Headquarters, it has become the perfect home-away-from-home during Motorcycle Week. Dry and full hookup spots are available with amazing views of the racetrack.

The New England Racing Museum, located on Rt 106 in front of The Flat Track next to the speedway's South Entrance. The museum is open 10–4 Sat. & Sun., June 10-11 and Fri.-Sun., June 16-18.







You may believe what you will, because it has been 34 years and this issue should have be handled by now. The Northeast POW/MIA Network continues to fight for **Capt. Ike Camacho.**

The Green Beret, Ike Camacho issue continues! Why??? Good question! The Northeast POW/MIA Network is getting closer to an answer. As last reported to you, we were working with Military Staffing DC and with Boards who were Vetting Ike?? After more than a year, we learned that was all false! Seems anything to stop this American Hero from receiving the Medal of Honor he was put in for back in 1965 has been done. We recently learned that his records were classified! Imagine that, longer than President Kennedys. Why? Maybe because Ike's military record is more than 2000 pages long. What could be in there?

Captain Ike Camacho, was given the Bronze Star, That's a Bronze Star for being held for 18 months and having courage to escape which was his duty as he saw it and gets a Bronze Star!

The Second Person to escape from a Camp was Nick Rowe a true Hero, received a Silver Star! So, what did the Army have to do? Go back and Update Ike's Bronze to a Silver Star! Why was that held from him in first place? Maybe it would prove an embarrassment that an Mexican/Native American to be first anything, especially Medal of Honor.

A few years ago Ike's Silver Star was upgraded to the Distinguished Service Cross by George W. Bush. This sounds fine. However, Ike was put up for the Medal of Honor, so why not? I was told way back, as a Mexican/Native American, I was never going to see the Medal of Honor no matter how many speak your name, I believed them"!

The Network, along with Senator Hassan's offices, continues working on this matter. With the effort of Sen. Maggie Hassan and her staff we are pleased to announce that Ike's progress has been sent to the Honor Board which is made up of three 1 Star Generals and 1 Ex-POW. From there if positive goes to the Secretary of Defense and then onto the President of the United States. This has been a three-year effort by the advocate of the Northeast POW/MIA Network and all of those who stand the vigils.

For those who have yet to participate in the **Freedom Ride**, the real focus of the ride is to bring into light an issue that affects hundreds of Americans and their families, those men and women missing in action or held prisoner during times of war and/or conflict.

If you are unable to participate in the **Freedom Ride**, please make time to be at Hesky Park for the "**Northeast POW/MIA Network Vigil**" that begins at 7:00PM. Let your voice be heard.

nce again the grudge racing pitting the old Tank Shifter
Harley's and Indians from the 1930's and 40's will take place at the
New Hampshire Motor Speedway during the FIM North America Vintage Road
Racing Championships June 10-11. For the past several years the drama of this
match race has drawn competitors from across the United States to try and settle which
machine will win the coveted event.

The history of the "Laconia" races dating from the 1930's through the 1940's saw Indian and Harley battle it out for the coveted "Laconia" win. That battle with these vintage racers still continues today as these old machines fight all out in some amazing races to once again establish dominance on the track.

Noted vintage racer, Doc Batsleer from Daytona, Florida usually brings a collection of the old racers for some of the young guns to try and race. Though the "young guns" can be very fast, it is sometimes the wily old racers that have raced these old bikes for years that show the way around to victory. There is nothing like the noise, smoke, and smell of these old machines to transport you back 70-80 years in time to racing the way it was.

Racing Sidecars Return for FIM Road Race Championships – June 10-11

he incredible vintage road racing sidecars will return for the FIM North America Vintage Road Race Championships June 10-11 at the New Hampshire Motor Speedway. Vintage sidecar racing has to be one of the most insane, thrilling and dangerous forms of motor racing. A three-wheel vehicle carrying two people hanging on ... racing on skinny tires... with high horsepower...traveling inches from the ground is a recipe for excitement found nowhere else. The driver slides the sidecar through the corners wrestling for control while the passenger climbs from side to side on a small platform acting as a ballast keeping the sidecar from flipping. Not for the faint of heart, sometimes passengers have been known to fall off the machine



at speed unnoticed by the driver. Because of intense driver focus, the driver only becomes aware of the missing passenger when he attempts to take the next corner with devastating results. Some describe sidecar racing as a gladiator sport like the Roman chariot racing. *


ocated on scenic Route 106 in Loudon, NH, there's a lot to see and do at the Speedway during Motorcycle Week. Headlined by the flat track race, the FIM North America Vintage Road Race Championships June 10-11 and the 100th running of the Loudon Classic on June 18, there's a lot happening on the Speedway property all during the Laconia Motorcycle Week 2023.

The New England Racing Museum is within an easy walk from the new quarter-mile dirt track. Displays include racing motorcycles from the past, all manner of racecars, a huge collection of trophies won by New England-based racers, New England's largest motorsports library, and helmets worn by top racers. The museum is an all-New England facility.

The museum's motorcycle collection includes a wild homebuilt drag bike powered by a 405-CID Buick engine. See a BSA Goldstar motorcycle Jody Nicholas rode like the one he rode to victory in the 1963 "Laconia" National despite falling off at the start of the last lap during the race at the old Belknap track road. See the ultra-rare ROKON "works" flat track bike, (one of less than ten produced), the ultra-rare Honda "works" flat tracker (one of 4 produced), the TZ500 Yamaha ridden by the first woman to complete the Daytona 200, and the ultra-rare MSDS 175 Parilla racer veteran of two Motogiro d'Italias. Two new museum additions... one is the AMA Laconia National winning Suzuki ridden by John Bettencourt and the other is the BMW racing sidecar that has raced continuously since the 1960's to many championships. All machines on exhibit have a race history in New England events.

Museum admission is free to members and just \$10 to non-members. The museum is open Friday, Saturdays and Sundays from 10AM-4PM. Additional days and hours will be added to Motorcycle Week. Additional activities each year at the Speedway include manufacturers and vendors that are set up at the Speedway where they will be offering demo rides.

There's so much to see and do at the Speedway. Camping is available with or without water & power. ★

the Daytona Beach flea market, which will be open all week.





njoy some great rides while in Daytona!

Daytona Beach to Ponce Inlet – How often do you get to enjoy breakfast over the ocean? That's right, I said OVER the ocean, not just over looking the ocean, at Crabby Joe's in Daytona Beach shores. This favorite ride is perfect when you're looking for a unique breakfast destination and a day oceanside. The ride route ends at the Ponce Inlet Lighthouse.

Daytona Beach to Edgewater – Volusia County is home to a twisty stretch of back road tunneling through magnificent live oaks from Daytona Beach to Edgewater, Volusia County's "southern loop".

New Smyrna Beach – The route from Daytona Beach to New Smyrna Beach takes you along quiet country 2-lane roads, past several local biker-friendly hangouts and provides views of the Intercoastal waterway, historic New Smyrna and the beach.

DeLand via DeLeon Springs State Park – This ride will take you through some of the scenic roads in West Volusia including a visit to DeLeon Springs State Park to the historic downtown mainstreet in DeLand. The first weekend of Bike Week each year, DeLand hosts a Bike Rally with music, shopping, great food and a welcoming atmosphere.

Vintage Hillclimb in the Weirs – June 13

id you know that the original "Laconia" Hillclimbs were held on Tower Street right off Lakeside Avenue in the Weirs? 1916 was the first hillclimb on Tower Street in the early days of the Gypsy Tour and subsequent races. Tower Street was a dirt road in those early years and very challenging. Today, Tower Street is paved and remains a real spectacle of motorcycle sounds and sights as they climb the hill at speed.

Sometime after 1924, the eventual AMA Sanctioned Hillclimb moved to the Gunstock Mountain Resort on the 70-meter ski jump. Today the Vintage Tower Hill hillclimb on Tuesday June 13 in the Weirs will get you geared up for the Gunstock Pro-Am event at Gunstock on Wednesday June 14.

On Tuesday, June 13th – The invitational vintage "Hillclimb Exhibition" will be held on Tower Street. It may be paved now, but it's still as steep as ever! Riders will run for time up Tower Street from 11AM-2PM. The "Hillclimb Exhibition" will be hosted by the United States Classic Racing Association (USCRA).

This completely free to spectators, unique event is defi-

nitely a blast from the past featuring vintage machines from 1916 to the mid1970's! A 1960 Triumph won the King of the Hill honors a couple of years back with a young woman riding. The oldest machines were a 1917 Indian with a sidecar and a 1916 Excelsior. Make sure to get there early



for a good viewing spot along the Tower Street hill. *



In recent years, the city has launched a "Ride with a Local" program. The guides have been in South Dakota for years and know their way around. They show riders some of the best back roads and spectacular sights in the Hills.

The Sturgis Rally is a family reunion of sorts for many who come to the town of 7,000 in the Black Hills of South Dakota. They meet old friends at familiar locations and forge new friendships as well.

"There's a strong bond that exists among those who come

to the Rally year after year," said Sturgis Mayor Mark Carstensen.

The Rally has changed over the years, but the core of the Rally spirit hasn't, Carstensen said.

"Our success comes in the God-given beauty of the Black Hills that exist right in our backyard. Year after year, rallygo-

ers tell us the reason the come is for the spectacular rides we have to offer," Carstensen said.

The City of Sturgis' heritage runs deep. It was founded as an old Cavalry outpost in 1878, and as of last year, the Rally celebrated 82 years of helping riders (of "steel horses" in modern times) uncover, revisit and participate in the



thrills of the Sturgis and the Rally experience.

The event that today is the City of Sturgis Motorcycle Rally began in 1938, when Clarence "Pappy" Hoel, his wife, Pearl, and a group of motorcycle enthusiasts decided to host a race in Sturgis. Nine participants and a mere 200 spectators attended.

Today the City of Sturgis Motorcycle Rally is one of, if not "the" largest gatherings of motorcycle enthusiasts in the world. The 2023 City of Sturgis Motorcycle Rally, Aug. 4 -13, celebrates the 83rd Anniversary of the event that has become known to motorcycle enthusiasts throughout the world as the "Granddaddy of 'em all".

Two-wheelers travel from around the globe to enjoy rock concerts, motorcycle racing, hill climbs, and scenic roads.

Attendance hovers around a half a million with participants from all 50 states as well as Canada and dozens of other international communities including Japan, Australia, Germany, and England.

Demographic surveys of those attending the 2022 City of Sturgis Motorcycle Rally show the average age of attendees continues to fall, but the number of attendees who don't

own a motorcycle has actually increased.

"We're achieving the goal of broadening the appeal of the event to a larger and younger audience," said Beka Zerbst, Sturgis City Council member.

If you haven't been to the Sturgis Motorcycle Rally, you simply must go experience it.

Those who attend soon realize that they want to make plans to return.

There are countless memories shared by rallygoers that signify a shared spirit. So with a cherished past and roaring future, it is assured that the Rally will continue year after year, mile after mile. *

Honoring Motorcycling History

he mission of the Sturgis Motorcycle Museum and Hall of Fame is to collect, preserve, and interpret the history of motorcycling, honor those who have made a significant impact on the sport and the lifestyle, and pay tribute to the heritage of the Sturgis Motorcycle Rally.

The Sturgis Motorcycle Museum & Hall of Fame opened in 2001. The Museum is housed in an historic post office, located at the intersection of historic Main Street and Junction Avenue. The Museum is right in the heart of the Sturgis Rally.

The Sturgis Motorcycle Museum & Hall of Fame has about eighty motorcycles and about fifty original works of art by famed motorcycle artists. The motorcycles in the collection include a 1910 FN Four (a French four-cylinder motorcycle) to extreme custom motorcycles built by world-renowned builders like Donnie Smith. The Museum also has an extensive collection of memorabilia and photos from the Sturgis Rally and the riders who helped to make the Rally what it is today.

The Sturgis Motorcycle Museum's Hall of Fame is unique in that it isn't focused on one aspect of the sport of motorcycling. The Hall of Fame honors people who have made a significant impact on motorcycling. Those contributions can be through racing, manufacturing, customizing, or culture.

Nominations are taken throughout the year. The easiest way to nominate someone is to go the Museum's website (www.sturgismuseum.com) and follow the nomination process. Nominations can also be mailed to the Museum.

In addition to Hall of Fame nominations, there are special awards that the Museum bestows to honor special people and groups.

Arlen Ness Lifetime Achievement Award

The Arlen Ness Lifetime Achievement Award honors those who have greatly contributed to the world of motorcycling and have been recognized by many of the leading motorcycle-related organizations, their peers, and the general riding community.

Founders Award

This special designation is reserved for individuals who have played a special role in the founding, maintaining, and / or promoting the Sturgis Motorcycle Museum & Hall of Fame.

Freedom Fighter

The Freedom Fighter award recognizes the sacrifices individuals across the nation, and world, have made to protect the rights of motorcyclists through their efforts in the political arena and in grassroots motorcycles rights organizations.



JC "Pappy" Hoel Outstanding Achievement Award

This award is reserved for individuals who have played a special role in the founding, maintaining, and / or promoting of the Sturgis Motorcycle Rally.

Kickstands Down Recognition

Kickstands down recognition is a posthumous recognition. It's reserved for individuals who have made a significant impact on our industry but are not here with us today.

The Museum receives nominations throughout the year. All nominations are reviewed, and the inductees are announced in February. The Hall of Fame Breakfast and Induction Ceremony is held on the Wednesday morning of the Sturgis Rally at the Lodge in Deadwood SD. The 2023 ceremony will be on August 9 at 9AM. Tickets go on sale in March and are available through the Sturgis Motorcycle Museum & Hall of Fame website www.sturgismuseum.com.

The Sturgis Motorcycle Museum & Hall of Fame is open daily. During the Sturgis Motorcycle Rally, it's open from 9AM-6PM. Summer hours are 9AM-5PM and winter hours are 10AM-4PM.

The Sturgis Motorcycle Museum & Hall of Fame's collections change regularly, so stop in to see what's new and help to preserve the legacy of the Sturgis Motorcycle Rally.

his 1922 Ace Inline Four is owned by collector Junior Glover who generously loaned it to the Sturgis Motorcycle Museum & Hall of Fame.

William G. Henderson is recognized as an innovative designer of early motorcycles and well known for his design of 4-cylinder engines. He was the original owner of the Henderson Motorcycle company, founded in 1911.

In 1917, Henderson sold his company to Ignatz Schwinn, the owner of the Schwinn (bicycle) company and

Excelsior Motorcycles. He continued to work for the company and designed motorcycles under the Excelsior Henderson name.



In 1919, Henderson left the company and partnered with a wealthy financier to open Ace motorcycle company. The foundation of the company was to be a luxury four-cylinder motorcycle with a chain drive. Henderson was careful in the production of these new Ace motorcycles not to infringe on any patents owned by his former company.

Tragically, Henderson was killed after being struck by a car while test riding a new model in 1922. He was testing the new Ace Sport Solo, said to have numerous innovations and to be ahead of its time. Unfortunately, Henderson's death began the slow decline of the company, which changed hands at least twice between 1924 and 1927. In 1927, the company's remaining assets were purchased by Indian Motorcycle Company who continued to produce an inline four under the name Indian Ace until 1929 when the model was discontinued.

Jackpine Gypsies MC

Jackpine Gypsies Motorcycle Club – "The World Famous Sturgis Rally Founders since 1936"

he Jackpine Gypsies Motorcycle Club in Sturgis, S.D., is one of the oldest AMA-chartered off-road clubs. Founded in 1936 and chartered in 1937, the club joined with the City of Sturgis to hold a local rally over a three-day period in August, featuring a half-mile dirt-track race. Following that race, the Sturgis rally continued to grow into one of the most popular destination events in the country, attracting tens of thousands of motorcyclists to the Black Hills, S.D., area each year.

The Jackpine Gypsies half-mile also thrived, attracting numerous AMA Motorcycle Hall of Famers over the years, including Bill Tuman, Bobby Hill, Dick Mann and Dick Klamfoth, among others. The Jackpine Gypsies were inducted into the AMA Motorcycle Hall of Fame in 1997. For 2023 schedule info, check out **jackpinegypsies.com/**

USS South Dakota Commemorative Harley-Davidson Street Glide Motorcycle

o honor the US Navy's vessel, the USS South Dakota (SSN 790), several entities united to create a one-of-a-kind motorcycle that proudly represents the ship and its namesake state for years to come. As the USS South Dakota services in the Navy's submarine for over the next 30 years, an ignition key for the commemorative motorcycle is kept on board. Any Sailor assigned to the boat will be given the rights to take it for a ride anywhere in the state of South Dakota.

The Harley-Davidson Motor Company donated the 2018 Street Glide motorcycle and several custom parts for the project. J&L Harley-Davidson of Sioux Falls, SD and Black Hills Harley-Davidson of Rapid City, SD provided labor, parts, and maintenance. Artist Mickey Harris of Menno, SD, who developed and created the bike's artwork.

The USS South Dakota commemorative HD Street Glide motorcycle is on display at the Sturgis Motorcycle Museum, in the military gallery. The gallery also features memorabilia from the USS South Dakota commissioning ceremony and a scale model of the USS South Dakota battleship. When a Plankholder from the USS South Dakota (SSN 790) is in town, you may see the bike out riding the Black Hills.





Live Free, Share the Road

Motorcycle Safety is about Sharing the Road: As the weather warms this spring, hundreds of thousands of motorcyclists will be on the roads, ready to ride. One way we can reduce traffic fatalities and keep our roads safe is for drivers to understand motorcycle safety challenges such as size and visibility, and riding practices like downshifting and weaving to be able to anticipate and respond to motorcyclists' behavior. Motorcycles are among the smallest and most vulnerable vehicles on the road, putting riders at greater risk of death and serious injury in a crash. In fact, research and state-level data consistently identifies motorists as being at-fault in more than half of all multivehicle motorcycle-involved collisions.

Older Riders: According to the Insurance Institute for Highway Safety, Riders 50 and older made up 36% of all motorcycle fatalities in 2017. So-called "re-entry riders." who rode in their 20s and decided to take it up again in their late 40s to 60s face additional challenges today: more traffic, more powerful bikes, more distracted drivers and diminished physical skills. If you're going to ride a motorcycle, it's important to commit to a lifetime of learning new skills and brushing up on the old ones.

Protect Yourself and Others: A helmet is the most important equipment a rider can use. In 2018, 75% of motorcyclists in NH were not wearing a helmet. Helmets are estimated to be 37% effective in preventing fatal injuries.

Here are some more helpful safety tips:

- As a new rider, choose a bike that fits you. Many inexperienced riders tend to choose a motorcycle above their skill level "supersport bikes" have driver death rates about four times that of cruisers or standard bikes, according to the Insurance Institute for Highway Safety.
- New riders should take a motorcycle safety course, and experienced riders should take refresher courses after being off their bikes for a while. You can find out more about the New Hampshire Motorcycle Rider Training Program offered through the Division of Motor Vehicles.
- Know the rules of the road.
- Be aware that riding with a passenger requires more skill.
- Never drink and ride.
- Drive defensively, especially at intersections, where half of all collisions occur.
- Watch for hazards on the roads.
- Assume you are invisible to other motorists and position yourself to be seen.
- Use headlights day and night
- Be courteous; don't weave in and out of lanes, or ride on the shoulder or between lanes.
- Don't speed.
- Wear bright and/or reflective clothing that is durable and boots that cover the ankles.
- Wear goggles, glasses or use a face shield that's ventilated to prevent fogging, make sure it's clear if riding at night.



The Origins of the Laconia Classic

he start of the Laconia TT National in 1939 before the Belknap Park course was paved.

The Laconia (NH) Classic was once the second biggest motorcycle race in America, second only to Daytona. The race had origins that pre-dated even Daytona. What's interesting about Laconia, is that unlike Sturgis, which originated as a motorcycle race later to become a much more famous as an annual motorcyclist rally, Laconia actually started as an annual Gypsy Tour dating back to 1917 and was a well-established gathering, years later that spawned a national race.

Motorcycling, which thrived for the first half of the 1910s as a major mode of transportation, began to slip by the mid-decade with Ford's continuous improvements to its mass production techniques and the resultant low-cost Model T. In 1917 America's motorcycle industry body, the Federation of

American Motorcyclists (FAM) was looking for ways to stimulate motorcycle ridership and sales and came up with a series of tours they dubbed Gypsy Tours. These tours would take place across the country, but almost immediately the tour held in New England became the biggest. It made sense, in that the bulk of motorcycle makers during the early year of the industry were in New England. Indian, the biggest motorcycle manufacturer in the world at that point, was in Springfield, MA.

And the Laconia Gypsy Tour had the major population base of Boston and New York City from which to draw. The rally grew rapidly and would hold the honor as the biggest annual gathering of motorcyclists until it was overtaken by Sturgis probably sometime in the 1970s.

Big-time national racing came to the New England Gypsy Tour with the advent of AMA's then new Class C (production based) racing category. Swanzey, New Hampshire hosted AMA 200-Mile TT Nationals starting in 1934. A local hero Babe Tancrede won that first 200-Mile TT National on a Harley-Davidson. Another local, the relatively unheralded Hanford Marshall won the big TT event in '36. The '36 race was dubbed "The Derby of Death". Racer Richard Ashbrook died when he ran off the course into a tree and a spectator was killed when he was hit attempting to cross the track.





The Swanzey TT course was 3.3 miles long over rough roads, up and down hills and many turns. A newspaper estimated the crowds at the Swanzey TT at 10,000, a massive gathering during the Great Depression.

Old Orchard Beach, Maine, hosted the New England Gypsy

Tour in 1937 and a 100-mile National was held. The race was won by Indian-backed rider Lester Hillbish, who actually had to borrow a motorcycle from a spectator at the last minute, when his bike quit running. Hillbish was offered the bike by motorcycle dealer Horace Fritz, from

Hillbish's hometown of Reading. PA. Hillbish won the 100-miler, not only having to make an extra stop owing to a stock tank, but it was especially notable since, Fritz had ridden the motorcycle 500 miles to the race! The fans, made aware of Hillbish's situation, went nuts when he took the

checkered flag a lap ahead of Ben Campanale, who would go on to win the Daytona 200 in 1938 and '39.

Springfield (MA) Indian Motorcycle Dealer Fritzie Baer was instrumental in bringing the New England Gypsy Tour races to the Belknap Recreational Area in Laconia, New Hampshire. Interestingly Baer later left Indian to become managing director of the park. In that capacity, he promoted the Laconia Classic (now called the Loudon Classic) road races through 1963. In spite of being called the Laconia Classic, the Belknap Park circuit was actually located in neighboring Gilford.


The first national at Belknap in 1938 was a 200-miler won by Daytona winner Iron Man Ed Kretz on an Indian. That gave Kretz several distinctions – he was the first rider to win the what would become known as the Laconia Classic, he was the

first rider outside of the Northeastern part of the country to win the national race associated with the New England Gypsy Tour, and finally he was the only 200-mile winner of the Laconia Classic. In 1939 the race at Belknap would become a 100 miler.

With the scenic environment and exciting course at Belknap, the New England Tour had found a permanent home for its big race. The races throughout


the years would see improvement to the one-mile course, going from all dirt or gravel, to being paved. It went from being classified a TT national to a road race national in 1940.

The race grew steadily, but then absolutely exploded in popularity after it resumed after World War II. Look at images of the race in the 1940s and '50s and you'll see just massive crowds of fans crowded around the length of the wooded circuit. Word of the race spread and CBS made Laconia one its earliest annual sporting events covered.

Laconia went along fine until the early 1960s when unruly attendees starting drawing strong complaints from local residents. It reached a breaking point and in 1964 the New England Dealer Association announced it could not come to an agreement with local officials to host the rally and the race.

The answer to renew the race was to build a specially built road course and Bryar Motorsports Park was completed at nearby Loudon in time for the renewal of what would now become the Loudon Classic. Unfortunately, in order to satisfy complaints by locals citizens, local officials went way too heavy handed in '65. They enacted unreasonable local ordinances that basically allowed police to arrest groups of three of more people who were "loitering". In order to enforce these stringent rules with 20,000 motorcyclists, a large group of National Guardsmen were station in place at Weirs Beach setting the stage for over-policing resulting in an outbreak of violence now called the Weir's Beach Riot. Thousands of Laconia attendees threw rocks, burned cars and damaged buildings during night of rioting in this resort area. More than 100 persons were arrested and more than 60 persons were treated at hospitals.

The '65 riots marked a turning point for the rally. It gradually diminished in numbers, though the national races went on at Loudon through 2002. Incidentally, the nighttime partying at the new track became both legendary and infamous with the

view from Animal Hill looking like something out of Apocalypse Now on particularly crazy evenings.

The rally continues today and races are still held during Laconia Bike Week, but have been club events now since 2002, but for an amazing stretch from the late 1930s to the early 2000s, the Laconia/Loudon Classic was one of the truly elite motorcycle racing events in America, and attracted massive crowds.

he Half Moon, the block at the very center of Weirs Beach, has been at the heart of Motorcycle Week action since the early 1950's, when the business was established by Sidney Ames. The very symbol of Weirs Beach, the iconic, neon Weirs Beach arrow sign, built in 1956, was a result of Sidney's efforts. His three sons have carried on with the business, now known officially as the Half Moon Enterprises. They have also carried on with promoting Weirs Beach, in 1998 establishing the website WeirsBeach.com, the best source for general information about the area.

The Half Moon block begins at the corner of New Hampshire Avenue and extends down Lakeside Avenue to Tower Street. On the left corner, Lakeside View Pizza sells the freshest, tastiest pizza in town. Next door, there are many exciting vendors located in the Half Moon Penny Arcade and Bumper Cars buildings, including American Iron Outfitters, Tennessee Leather, Joe's Steel, and the tattoo artistry of Mr. Bill's Roadhouse. At the center of the block, the Half Moon Gift Shop has a great selection of Motorcycle Week T-Shirts, jewelry, and accessories. On the right corner, you'll find Hot Leathers located in the Half Moon Family Fun Center building.

Tucked behind all the Lakeside Avenue action is the Half

Moon Motel & Cottages, the most convenient lodging location in the area, within very close walking distance of all the Motorcycle Week activities. 

Don't block travel lanes, don't park on private property without permission and the #1 NO-NO – don't park in a handicap assessable spot without the proper license plate or placard. These laws are strictly enforced.

Here's our Parking Recommendations:

Park for FREE on Lakeside Avenue but be sure to follow the one-way travel and don't have your tire over the line.

Parking at the following locations is typically \$10/bike and car parking may also be available.

- Endicott Park: This is the lot right at the beach. The
 Weirs Action Committee is a non-profit organization,
 and the parking lot is their biggest fundraiser of the
 year. Net proceeds are for the beautification and benefit
 of Weirs Beach.
- Weirs Beach Community Park Association: This lot is located behind the Weirs Beach Fire Station on Lucern Avenue and is an easy walk to Lakeside Avenue.
- Foster Avenue: This lot is at the corner of the street and is run by a trusted Motorcycle Week business owner and resident.

Gypsy Tours began as small gatherings of motorcyclists who rode to a scenic spot for a picnic and motorcycle competitions. There often were races, including hillclimbs, "Tourist Trophy" (TT) and dirt-track events, along with field meets involving such motorcycle games as slow races, stake races and plank riding. The events eventually evolved into some of the largest roadriding events of the year. Started by the Motorcycle and Allied Trades Association, the official Gypsy Tours came under the supervision of the AMA at its founding in 1924. 

How to Avoid Animal Collisions on the Roads


his motorcycle season, as you enjoy the scenic views that New Hampshire has to offer, keep in mind that wildlife can pop up when you least expect it. Here are some useful tips to avoid animal encounters of the third kind!





- Always use an aggressive visual search pattern when riding. By looking far and near and side to side you will see animals and other roadway users before they enter your path of travel. This will give you time to avoid collision in a more controlled manner.
- Deer are not solitary animals, they travel with their herd. Slow down if you see a deer. It's likely there are more close behind.
- Don't challenge large animals it's a safer bet to turn around and seek an alternative route if possible.
- Always slow down and use your high beams in all animal crossing areas.
- If you often ride the roads at night, invest in powerful headlights.
- Do not override your headlight. At higher speeds, it can take more distance to stop than your headlight reaches. By the time you see something in your path it is already too late. Slow down at night!
- If you're riding in a group spread out. If there's a collision, it will prevent one rider from taking out the whole group.
- As always, don't forget to wear protective gear you never know who or what you will encounter on the open road.
- Take training that will assist you in honing skills needed when that animal encounter does happen. Information on training is available at nh.gov/dmv.





Plan your route. Although it can be tempting to hit the road without a destination in mind, planning a route will ensure you'll stay well fed and gassed up. If you don't have a GPS, get up-to-date maps and go online to get a list of hotels and campgrounds near your route so you can find a place to rest for the night.





"PhantomBiker" on Mt. Washington "Ride to the Sky!"

breathtaking biker ride up the Auto Road on Mt. Washington – offers spectacular scenery, challenging terrain and a summit view from the highest peak in the Northeast. From the mountain's base the rider passes through lush forest and soon emerges above the tree line to stunning vistas of the Presidential Range. Sometimes – if the weather conditions are just right – fog and clouds remain in the lower valleys while the biker rides above the clouds to the summit.

Near the summit, a lone photographer will capture a unique image of you, your bike and the magnificent mountain background. Each year, PhantomBiker makes the pilgrimage from Rochester, MN to Laconia, NH an excellent photo site on the Auto Road.

Starting on the Friday before the official start of the Rally, PhantomBiker is on the mountain to photograph each biker as they make their ascent. PhantomBiker began taking biker images in 2006 and has been on the mountain during the Rally for sixteen Laconia events. Rain or shine, good weather or poor, PhantomBiker captures your ride.

Bikers can view their image (usually the evening of when they rode up the mountain) by going to www.phantombiker.com and finding the day and time of their ride.

The name "PhantomBiker" was created because often bikers are so focused on the road that they are unaware that





PhantomBiker Is even present. Sometimes bikers pass by so quickly that sixty or seventy images are taken in less than a minute while it can slow down to three or four biker images an hour.

A biker as well as a photographer, PhantomBiker rides both a road motorcycle and a dual sport bike, accumulating tens of thousands of highway and backcountry miles. Rides include most of the western states and the Gulf Coast as well as British Columbia and Alberta. Dual sport rides include the Continental Divide Ride (down the continental Divide from the Canadian border to the Mexican border), the White Rim Trail in Utah, several rides on the Alpine Loop in the San Juan Mountains of southwest Colorado, and various backcountry trips through Colorado. Despite all the rides, PhantomBiker realized he had very few pictures of himself actually riding a motorcycle. With that in mind, "PhantomBiker" motorcycle photography was created to capture riders as they rode their bikes while Mt Washiington and the Presidential Range offer a stunning background to every image.

If you're at the Laconia Rally, make the "Ride to the Sky!" on the Auto Road part of your ride this year. PhantomBiker may just capture a "once-in-a-lifetime" photo of you and your ride! *


Ed Fisher

Many may not know this, but Bob Lawton played a huge part in bringing back Laconia Motorcycle Week to its full 8 days in 1991. Although not a motorcyclist himself, Bob certainly knew the history of Motorcycle Week and Laconia and was interested in bringing it back to its former glory that disappeared after 1965. He provided the then, Rally & Race Motorcycle Week Association, with a place for Rally Headquarters to be set up. Rally Headquarters remained at Funspot, Bob's pride and joy business, for two years. Those two years gave the Association and the Rally a chance to begin to grow back to what it once was. That in and of itself is no small feat for the rally. Bob will be remembered for many things he has done for the Laconia-Weirs Beach area. But what he did for Motorcycle Week is what I, and many other motorcyclists, will always remember him for.

Ron Aylward passed away at the young age of 66 due to illness. Well known around the motorcycling world, he was fondly thought of by those who rode with him. He was a fixture of Laconia Motorcycle Week since the 1970's. He also attended Sturgis, Daytona, along with other rallies around the country. And is missed by many.

FIM North America Vintage Road Race Championships Return to NHMS, June 10, 11

ew Hampshire Motor Speedway will once again will

be the scene of the 21st running of the FIM North America Vintage Road Race Championships on its 1.6 mile road course. The vintage racers from across the US and hopefully Canada if the border opens up will compete at this internationally sanctioned event. What classifies as vintage for this event? Basically, all the race machines competing were manufactured prior to 2000 with the oldest race bikes dating back into the 1930's. Make no mistake, the racers are not just parading the old bikes but rather this is flat out elbow to elbow racing at speeds exceeding 130 mph for the fastest machines.

The old ridged frame Indian and Harley tank shifter race machines from the 1930's and 40's are one of the featured races. These old racers have no rear suspension. Sliding

NEWHAMPSHIRE these old machines in the corners on the pavement is the normal way to get around the

corners. This throw back in time racing can only be appreciated by actually seeing the old machines in action.

Of additional thrilling excitement are the fabulous vintage sidecars. The passenger (monkey) hangs off the sidecar platform scraping his/her shoulder on the ground to act as ballast for the machine in the corners. Without that passenger ballast balancing the outfit, the sidecar would instantly flip over in a turn. Most of the passengers are women... some wives, some girlfriends and others just speed thrill seekers. In addition to the monkey balancing the machine, the driver must slide the outfit through the corners and throttle steer the controlled slide.

The real heart of the vintage races at this event are the machines from the 1960's through mid 1980's. Here the old British machines like Triumph and BSA still compete on par against the new wave of Japanese multi cylinder bikes of the 1970's.

Admission to the races allows all spectators to park inside the NASCAR oval, wander the garages and have free access to the grandstands. Races are run rain or shine. *




