
rally in the world and as the City's Police Chief, it is truly my honor and pleasure to once again support this event!

Thus, the Peter Makris Memorial Run was born, first organized in 2007 as a charity ride during Laconia Motorcycle Week, with the dual aim of commemorating Makris and raising funds for a local cause close to his heart, the Laconia Fire Department Life Saving Fund.

The Run: A Journey of Remembrance

Each year, during the Laconia Motorcycle Week, The Peter Makris Memorial Run brings together hundreds of riders from all walks of life. The event begins with continental breakfast and registration at the NASWA Resort, where participants gather to pay their respects and share stories of their experiences with Peter. They even get a chip for a free beer "on Peter!"

The atmosphere is one of celebration, camaraderie, and a shared passion for motorcycles and the open road.

The scenic ride takes participants through picturesque the landscapes of New Hampshire, winding



through the small towns and along the shores of Lake Winnipesaukee and even has gone around the Loudon NASCAR track, the New Hampshire Motor Speedway for the last several years. The Charities

The event's charitable nature underscores the generosity and compassion that define the biker community. Proceeds from the memorial run are donated to local organizations and causes, carrying on Peter Makris' legacy of giving back to the community. Emphasis is placed on the Laconia Fire Department's Life Saving Fund, its rescue boats, the Easter Seals' Veterans Count program that serves the active-duty military, veterans and families in NH, the Lakes Region Community

Emergency Response Team, (CERT), the Belknap House **Homeless** Shelter for Families and the NH Veterans Home. where 10 TVs for the isolation rooms and most recently a large fresh air outdoor gazebo for the residents



were donated. Building Dreams For Marines also commemorates Makris' proud service in the U. S. Marine Corp, as the volunteer Board led non-profit is committed to retrofitting the homes of veterans with combat-related mobility issues to make them more accessible.

The Peter Makris Memorial Run at Laconia Motorcycle Week is much more than a ride; it is a celebration of life, a remembrance of a beloved figure, and a demonstration of the unbreakable bonds that unite bikers. It stands as a testament to the enduring spirit of brotherhood, compassion, and generosity that defines this unique community



A passerby even helped us push the bike up the ramp and offered us beers (but we saved them for later as we don't drink and drive). All in all, it only took a couple hours, and everything was right! @ciscomatic9 even promptly drove to my house the next day to return the straps that I let him keep for the rest of the trip like a proper dude!






Waiting for the start of the Hill Climb on Tower St at the Weirs.



This year will be the 36th year of the Meredith POW/MIA Awareness Vigil in Hesky Park and the 31st year of the Freedom Ride. As "Doc" stated all those years ago, "The Vigil was to simply bring awareness to this American issue, not just a veteran issue. Were live Americans left behind knowingly? All evidence stated and continue to states,... Yes! You may believe what you will, because it has been

35 years and this issue should have be handled by now. But in time "all would forget"...But, Not here in New Hampshire, the HUB of POW/MIA activity and awareness standing Vigils in Hesky Park, Manchester Veterans Park, and in Portsmouth! When we stop, we guarantee the Government stops looking.

For those who have yet to participate in the **Freedom Ride**, the real focus of the ride is to bring into light an issue that affects hundreds of Americans and their families, those men and women missing in action or held prisoner during times of war and/or conflict.

For the past 31 years, bikers, attending Laconia Motorcycle Week, have joined forces on Thursday evening and made history in the Northeast. Over the past several years, over two thousand motorcyclists have ridden their motorcycles in the Northeast POW/MIA Network® Freedom Ride. This year join us for the ride from all points in Country to "The Rock" Hesky Park, Meredith "The States Original POW/MIA Memorial".

The Northeast POW/MIA Network

Vigil in Meredith gained nation-wide attention some 35 years ago when a small group of veterans began holding weekly Thursday night vigils to bring to light the nation's lack of effort to account for all service men and women missing from Vietnam. Through times of basking heat, frigid rain storms and mid-winter snows, this small group of people held vigils to gain people's attention to the fact that members of our armed forces were unaccounted for and forgotten.

The Freedom Ride is slated to begin at 6:00 p.m. on Thursday, June



13, 2024, with line up beginning at 5:00 p.m. at the Route 11 ~ 1407 Lakeshore Road, Gilford, NH 03249 (Lowe's parking). This year looks to break all years in participation as the Northeast POW/MIA Network has joined forces with Blue and Gold Star families of N.H., all veterans and veteran organizations, together with all bikers and biker organizations, followed

with the Northeast POW/MIA Network Vigil.

The Northeast POW/MIA Network continues to fight for **Capt. Ike Camacho**.

The Green Beret, Ike Camacho issue continues! Why??? Good question! The Northeast POW/MIA Network is getting closer to an answer. As last reported to you, we were working with Military Staffing DC and with Boards who were Vetting Ike?? After more than a year, we learned that was all false! Seems anything to stop this American Hero from receiving the Medal of Honor he was put in for back in 1965 has been done. We recently learned that his records were classified! Imagine that, longer than President Kennedys. Why? Maybe because Ike's military record is more than 2000 pages long. What could be in there?

Captain Ike Camacho, was given the Bronze Star, That's a Bronze Star for being held for 18 months and having courage to escape which was his duty as he saw it and gets a Bronze Star!

The Second Person to escape from a Camp was Nick Rowe a true Hero, received a Silver Star! So, what did the Army have to do? Go back and Update Ike's Bronze to a Silver Star! Why was that held from him in first place? Maybe it would prove an embarrassment that an Mexican/Native American to be first anything, especially Medal of Honor.

A few years ago Ike's Silver Star was upgraded to the Distinguished Service Cross by George W. Bush. This sounds fine. However, Ike was put up for the Medal of Honor, so why not? Could it have been because they were held by not only North Vietnamese Army but "Cubans". After Ike's escape and his return to the United States, he was debriefed for weeks, in Hawaii.

Would that fact, along with the fact that Ike was Mexican/Native American, have anything to do with him not receiving the Medal of Honor as he was put in for?

So, here we are, 66 years later and an 86-year-old Green Beret still fighting for what is his. Actually, he's not fighting at all. He says," Guys, it's ok! I appreciate everything y'all, especially your Senator Hassan has

done on my behalf and Gracie but if the Good Lord wanted it to happen then it would happen. I was told way back, as a Mexican/Native American, I was never going to see the Medal of Honor no matter how many speak your name, I believed them"!

The Network, along with Senator Hassan's offices, continues working on this matter. With the effort of Sen. Maggie Hassan and her staff we are pleased to announce that Ike's progress has been sent to the Honor Board which is made up of three 1 Star Generals and 1 Ex-POW. From there if positive goes to the Secretary of Defense and then onto the President of the United States. This has been a three-year effort

by the advocate of the Northeast POW/MIA Network and all of those who stand the vigils.

For those who have yet to participate in the Freedom Ride, the real focus of the ride is to bring into light an issue that affects hundreds of Americans and their families, those men and women missing in action or held prisoner during times of war and/or conflict.

If you are unable to participate in the **Freedom Ride**, please make time to be at Hesky Park for the "**Northeast POW/MIA Network Vigil**" that begins at 7:00 p.m. Let your voice be heard.

On NH Rt 112 from Lincoln to Conway

How long is the Kancamagus Scenic Highway?

This Scenic Byway is within the boundary of the White Mountain National Forest and is 34.5 miles long. It boasts some fantastic views with regular scenic stops throughout. Remember, there are no businesses on this section of Route 112, and no gas stations. So make sure to fill your tank in Lincoln or Conway and bring along a picnic!

How long will it take to drive the highway?

Well, that's up to you! You can just drive straight through from Lincoln to Conway in just about an hour; or take the whole day checking out all the scenic views, trails, and waterfalls. Also as part of the state park system, you will find picnic areas and restrooms to stop at.

Lower Falls

On a hot summer day, this is a great spot to cool off, large rocks and falls are a great place to wade in and have a refreshing swim.



Albany Covered Bridge



The original bridge was built in 1857, it was destroyed in 1858 by a windstorm and then rebuilt. The NH Forest Service upgraded the bridge with Steel in 1981-1982.

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
11TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE MAE WEST MEMORIAL PET RUN





Daytona Beach to Ponce Inlet – How often do you get to enjoy breakfast over the ocean? That's right, I said OVER the ocean, not just over looking the ocean, at Crabby Joe's in Daytona Beach shores. This favorite ride is perfect when you're looking for a unique breakfast destination and a day oceanside. The ride route ends at the Ponce Inlet Lighthouse.

Daytona Beach to Edgewater – Volusia County is home to a twisty stretch of back road tunneling through magnificent live oaks from Daytona Beach to Edgewater, Volusia County's "southern loop".

LIVE FREE & SHARE THE ROAD!

otorcycle Safety is about Sharing the Road: As the weather warms this spring, hundreds of thousands of motorcyclists will be on the roads, ready to ride. One way we can reduce traffic fatalities and keep our roads safe is for drivers to understand motorcycle safety challenges such as size and visibility, and riding practices like downshifting and weaving to be able to anticipate and respond to motorcyclists' behavior. Motorcycles are among the smallest and most vulnerable vehicles on the road, putting riders at greater risk of death and serious injury in a crash. In fact, research and state-level data consistently identifies motorists as being at-fault in more than half of all multivehicle motorcycle-involved collisions.

Older Riders: According to the Insurance Institute for Highway Safety, Riders 50 and older made up 36% of all motorcycle fatalities in 2017. So-called "re-entry riders," who rode in their 20s and decided to take it up again in their late 40s to 60s face additional challenges today: more traffic, more powerful bikes, more distracted drivers and diminished physical skills. If you're going to ride a motorcycle, it's important to commit to a lifetime of learning new skills and brushing up on the old ones.

Protect Yourself and Others: A helmet is the most important equipment a rider can use. In 2018, 75% of motorcyclists in NH were not wearing a helmet. Helmets are estimated to be 37% effective in preventing fatal injuries.

Here are some more helpful safety tips:

- As a new rider, choose a bike that fits you. Many inexperienced riders tend to choose a motorcycle above their skill level "supersport bikes" have driver death rates about four times that of cruisers or standard bikes, according to the Insurance Institute for Highway Safety.
- New riders should take a motorcycle safety course, and experienced riders should take refresher courses after being off their bikes for a while. You can find out more about the New Hampshire Motorcycle Rider Training Program offered through the Division of Motor Vehicles.
- Know the rules of the road.
- Be aware that riding with a passenger requires more skill.
- Drive defensively, especially at intersections, where half of all collisions occur.
- Watch for hazards on the roads.
- Assume you are invisible to other motorists and position yourself to be seen.
- Use headlights day and night
- Be courteous; don't weave in and out of lanes, or ride on the shoulder or between lanes.
- Don't speed.
- Wear bright and/or reflective clothing that is durable
- and boots that cover the ankles.
- Wear goggles, glasses or use a face shield that's ventilated
- to prevent fogging, make sure it's clear if riding at night.

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

STURGIS ADDS DOWNTOWN STREET RACE TO 84TH EVENT

STURGIS - The history of the City of Sturgis Motorcycle Rally is steeped in camaraderie, adventure, and racing.

This year's Rally will harken back to its roots with the addition of a downtown street race.

This spectacle of motorcycle sport is scheduled for Aug. 11, 2024, coinciding with the final Sunday of the 84th Annual City of Sturgis Motorcycle Rally, continuing the city's legacy of motorcycle racing that dates back to 1938.

"The history and the legacy of the City of Sturgis Motorcycle Rally started with racing," said Sturgis Mayor Mark Carstensen. "To host this event, Sturgis is building the bridge to the future."

AMA Pro Racing, along with Øuterkind and the City of Sturgis, are collaborating on the major new event which will combine the rich heritage and tradition of the Sturgis Motorcycle Rally with American Flat Track's 70+ years of national championship racing. This groundbreaking event, taking place in the vibrant heart of downtown Sturgis, will feature an innovative mix of street and dirt sections and will be free for the public to attend.

Those who journey to Sturgis whether for the first time or the 50th, share a common spirit. They are passionate about gathering in a location of like-minded individuals who love the adrenaline-pumping experience of leaning into a curve in Vancocker Canyon and catching a glimpse of Mount Rushmore between the aspen along Iron Mountain Road.

In recent years, the city has launched a "Ride with a Local" program. The guides have been in South Dakota for years and know their way around. They show riders some of the best back roads and spectacular sights in the Hills.

The Sturgis Rally is a family reunion of sorts for many who come to the town of 7,000 in the Black Hills of South Dakota. They meet old friends at familiar locations and forge new friendships as well.

"There's a strong bond that exists among those who come to the Rally year after year," Carstensen said.

The Rally has changed over the years, but the core of the Rally spirit hasn't, the mayor said.

"Our success comes in the God-given beauty of the Black Hills that exist right in our backyard. Year after year, rallygoers tell us the reason they come is for the spectacular rides we have to offer," Carstensen said.



The City of Sturgis' heritage runs deep. It was founded as an old Cavalry outpost in 1878, and as of last year, the Rally celebrated 83 years of helping riders (of "steel horses" in modern times) uncover, revisit and participate in the thrills of the Sturgis and the Rally experience.

The event that is the City of Sturgis Motorcycle Rally began in 1938, when Clarence "Pappy" Hoel, his wife, Pearl, and his newly founded Jackpine Gypsies Motorcycle Club decided to host a race in Sturgis. Nine participants and a mere 200 spectators attended.

Today the City of Sturgis Motorcycle Rally is one of, if not "the" largest gatherings of motorcycle enthusiasts in the world. The 2024 City of Sturgis Motorcycle Rally,

Two-wheelers travel from around the globe to enjoy rock concerts, motorcycle racing, hill climbs, and scenic highways.

Attendance hovers around a half a million with participants from all 50 states as well as Canada and dozens of other international communities including Japan, Australia, Germany, and England.

Demographic surveys of those attending the 2023 City of Sturgis Motorcycle Rally show the average age of attendees continues to fall, but the number of attendees who don't own a motorcycle has actually increased.

Rally organizers say both statistics show the event shifting demographically.

"We're achieving the goal of broadening the appeal of the event to a larger and younger audience," said Beka Zerbst, Sturgis City Council President.

If you haven't been to the City of Sturgis Motorcycle Rally, you simply must go experience it. Those who



attend soon realize that they want to make plans to return.

So with a cherished past and roaring future, it is assured that the Rally will continue year after year, mile after mile.

UNLEASH THE ROAR OF HISTORY: STURGIS MOTORCYCLE MUSEUM AND HALL OF FAME

 \mathbf{I} t's only natural that the heartbeat of American motorcycling resonates from the Sturgis Motorcycle Museum and Hall of Fame, a motorcycle mecca nestled in South Dakota's iconic Black Hills. This museum is a pilgrimage site for riders, where the objects of admiration are a collection of vintage motorcycles, memorabilia from riders and racers, and the stories of thousands of people who have thrown a leg over a two-wheeler.

From early classics created by Harley-Davidson and Indian to present-day powerhouse race bikes, the museum showcases the innovation and the designs that draw adventure seekers to motorcycles, even in the dawn of the 20th century when engine-powered travel was just emerging from a horse-drawn world. This museum tells a unique story, weaving together the tales of the riders who conquered the roads and racetracks, and the experiences that defined the past 125 years of the motorcycle lifestyle.

The museum's motorcycle collection consists of over 80 motorcycles dating as far back as 1907. Though some are stock, most are shown as they were ridden... accessorized and loved by their owners. This is likely

the most extensive, permanent collection of customs and choppers in the world,

bikes from television build-off competitions and the chopper magazines in the 80's. There are vintage and current racing bikes spanning every notable American, Asian and European brand, many with championship credentials.

Most visitors are stunned at the huge amount of riding memorabilia, which ranges from iconic leather jackets to vintage rally badges. These items immerse visitors in the nostalgia of the open road and often bring back fond memories of a first motorcycle experience or a loved one who shared a passion for riding.

Even more amazing for many is the artwork the museum has collected for its exhibition areas. Sculptures and paintings by noted artists enjoy special places in the museum environment.

The Museum's Hall of Fame recognizes notable figures from motorcycling history, modern day innovators and individuals who have made the riding experience better, safer or more fun. Virtually every wall in the museum is adorned with plaques telling the story of members of the Hall of Fame.

Executive Director Heidi Haro is proud of the unique role that the Sturgis Museum plays in the motorcycle riding culture. "The museum is not only a wonderful place to visit during the Sturgis rally, but a year-round addition to any Black Hills vacation. We're delighted when riders swing by for a quick visit, then discover that they can't get enough of the experience we offer to our visitors."

STURGIS MUSEUM NAMES 2024 HONOREES FOR HALL OF FAME AND SPECIAL AWARDS

The Sturgis Motorcycle Museum and Hall of Fame recently announced its 2024 class of Hall of Fame inductees, along with individuals being recognized for their unique contributions to motorcycling. The 2024 inductees are individuals who have contributed to the sport through their art, their business prowess and their riding and customizing skills.

James Gregory - James founded the Run to the Wall, an annual cross country motorcycle ride to raise awareness of missing military veterans from US wars. The Run to the Wall now creates awareness of numerous veterans' issues and recognizes all who served.

Christine LePera and Bob LePera Jr. - Christine and Bob have a legacy in the motorcycle industry, as they lead LePera Industries, a successful motorcycle seat and accessory manufacturer founded by their father Bob LePera in 1972. Christine and Bob are a constant presence in the industry, supporting dealers and activities that benefit the riding community.

Ed Kerr - Ed is the co-founder of the Hamsters USA, a riding group noted for their contribution to local charities and the riding community. Ed's work toward establishing the group has changed the lives of both club members and those that have benefitted from their generosity.

David Uhl - David is a true motorcycling success story. Starting as a t-shirt artist for a Harley-Davidson licensee, David eventually turned his talents toward creating oil paintings that appeal to fans inside and outside of motorcycling. David was asked by Harley-Davidson to create a painting for presentation to the Pope in honor of the company's 110th Anniversary.

Roger Goldammer - Roger gained fame as the winner of the AMD World Championship of Custom Motorcycles three times, but his passion for motorcycles goes much deeper. The bikes he customizes from his Canadian shop are often racing-inspired and several have been raced at the annual Bonneville Speed Week.

Special Awards

Pete Hill - The Arlen Ness Lifetime Achievement Award honors those who have greatly contributed to the world of motorcycling and have been recognized by leading motorcycle-related organizations, their peers, and the general riding community. This year's Lifetime Achievement Award will be presented to Pete Hill, a legendary figure in motorcycle drag racing with several championships under his belt and an innovator in motorcycle performance with the high-performance Harley-Davidson racing engines that came out of his South Carolina shop. Pete was inducted into the Sturgis

Museum Hall of Fame earlier, and into the AMA Hall of Fame in 1990.

Jiggs Cressy - The Freedom Fighter Award recognizes the sacrifices individuals across the nation, and world, have made to protect the right of motorcyclists through their efforts in the political arena and in grassroots motorcycle rights and organizations. This year's award goes to Jiggs Cressy for his tireless leadership of ABATE of South Dakota, where he served as State Coordinator for 2009 to 2023, and held other leadership roles in the organization as well. Jiggs received the John "Farmer" Eggers Award, the most prized honor from the Motorcycle Riders Foundation, in 2018.

Bud Ekins - the Kickstands Down Recognition is posthumous recognition, reserved for individuals who have made a significant impact on the industry but weren't recognized while living. **James** "Bud" Sherwin Ekins is this year's honoree. Bud was widely regarded as one of the film industry's most accomplished stuntmen

the #1 NO-NO – don't park in a handicap accessible spot without the proper license plate or placard. These laws are strictly enforced. Here's our Parking Recommendations:

Park for FREE on Lakeside Avenue but be sure to follow the one-way travel and don't have your tire over the line.

Parking at the following locations is typically \$10/bike and car parking may also be available.

- Endicott Park: This is the lot right at the beach. The Weirs Action Committee is a non-profit organization, and the parking lot is their biggest fundraiser of the year. Net proceeds are for the beautification and benefit of Weirs Beach.
- Weirs Beach Community Park Association: This lot is located behind the Weirs Beach Fire Station on Lucern Avenue and is an easy walk to Lakeside Avenue.
- Foster Avenue: This lot is at the corner of the street and is run by a trusted Motorcycle Week business owner and resident.







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MOTORCYCLE ADVENTURE RIDING IN NH!

Adapted from "BEST ADV ROUTES TO TOURATECH DIRTDAZE RALLY IN NEW HAMPSHIRE." By Ron Lieback, July 2022

If you'd rather save the technical terrain for the "Touratech DirtDaze Rally" from August 14th - 18th, 2024 and have a relaxing ride instead, the path from Woodsville to Gorham is sure to please.

Spanning 231 miles, this stretch isn't particularly challenging, but what it lacks in difficulty it more than makes up for in history and scenery. And don't be mistaken; these roads are still a massive amount of fun. Again, here's the official description from the North East BDR:

Just a few miles up a rural dirt road from Woodsville and after crossing a long, covered bridge, you'll arrive at the Brick Store in Bath. The Brick Store is the oldest operating general store in the United States, established in 1791. Known for excellent fudge, smoked products, and a fine deli, this is a great place for take-out breakfast and lunch. The owner, Scott, is an avid motorcyclist so be sure to tell him we sent you.

Section 6 winds through picturesque dirt roads from the western border towards the east, passing through woodlands and farm fields, as well as some horse properties. Crossing over Interstate 93, the route takes Sandwich

Notch Road from Thornton to Sandwich, built in 1801 for the farming community that inhabited the area.

The road is now a single-lane dirt road that is great fun to ride, but remember that it is two-way traffic at all times. There's a must stop at a self-service ice cream and cheese shop, the Sandwich Creamery, tucked down a dirt road well off the beaten track. Our favorite flavor was Dirt Road – go figure. Soon after you'll find the magnificent view of Mount Chocorua and Lake Chocorua.

Turning north, the route takes the Kancamagus Highway for about ten miles. The highway is named after Chief Kancamagus, "The Fearless

One," of the Panacook tribe. Scenery of the Swift River and mountains is spectacular before turning on to Bear Notch Road. Forest service roads in the Bartlett Experimental Forest break up the ride on more dirt before getting through Franconia Notch on NH Route 302. After passing by the Mount Washington Hotel, the route takes Jefferson Notch Road around the base of Mount Washington. You'll soon come to appreciate any road referred to as a "notch' in New Hampshire.

The White Mountains, and especially Mount Washington, are a spectacular sight and the highlight of the NEBDR. The Mt. Washington Auto Road is not to be missed –it's a 7 - mile tar and dirt road up to the summit at 6,288 feet. The weather observatory is manned 365 days a year and has recorded some of the highest winds on the planet at 231 mph. Clear days offer amazing 360 - degree views for a hundred miles. There's a restaurant and museum at the summit. Nearby Gorham is the perfect White Mountain town to stay the night. If you weren't able to make it up Mt. Washington when you arrive into town, you can give it a fresh go the next morning.

HOW TO AVOID ANIMAL COLLISIONS ON THE ROADS

As you enjoy the scenic views that New Hampshire has to offer This motorcycle season, keep in mind that wildlife can pop up when you least expect it. Here are some useful tips to avoid animal encounters of the third kind!



- One important way to avoid messy encounters is to never drive drunk or high. Be sure to lock up and the leave the bike, or call a cab or a friend for a ride home. Don't let your friends ride drunk. Remember, Ride Sober or Get Pulled Over.
- Always use an aggressive visual search pattern when riding. By looking far and near and side to side you will see animals and other roadway users before they enter your path of travel. This will give you time to avoid collision in a more controlled manner.
- Deer are not solitary animals, they travel with their herd. Slow down if you see a deer. It's likely there are more close behind.
- Don't challenge large animals it's a safer bet to turn around and seek an alternative route if possible.
- Always slow down and use your high beams in all animal crossing areas.
- If you often ride the roads at night, invest in powerful headlights.
- Do not override your headlight. At higher speeds, it can take more distance to stop than your headlight reaches. By the time you see something in your path it is already too late. Slow down at night!
- If you're riding in a group spread out. If there's a collision, it will prevent one rider from taking out the whole group.
- As always, don't forget to wear protective gear you never know who or what you will encounter on the open road.
- Take training that will assist you in honing skills needed when that animal encounter does happen.
