For this event, "vintage" means race machines manufactured before the year 2000, with some of the oldest bikes dating back as far as the 1930s. But don't be fooled—these aren't just parades of old motorcycles. The races are high-speed, flat-out battles, with some of the fastest machines reaching speeds over 130 mph.

A Glimpse into the Past: Early Racing Machines

One of the highlights of the event is the chance to see legendary, rigid-frame Indian and Harley-Davidson tank-shifter race machines from the 1930s and 1940s.

These classic bikes, which lack rear suspension, require an old-school riding style that sees riders sliding through corners on the pavement, using their skill to maintain control at speed. It's a throwback to an era when racing was raw, dangerous, and purely mechanical—a spectacle that must be seen to be appreciated.


Vintage Sidecar Racing: Thrills and Balance

Adding to the excitement are the vintage sidecar races, where the "monkey"—the passenger—leans off the sidecar platform, scraping their shoulder on the ground to help balance the machine through the corners. Without this counterweight, the sidecar would flip over. Most of the passengers are women—some are wives or girlfriends, while others are adrenaline junkies seeking the ultimate thrill. In these races, the driver not only controls the bike but must also throttle-steer the outfit through a controlled slide, making for a truly unique racing experience. The Heart of the Vintage Action: 1960s to 1980s Machines

The real heart of the vintage racing action lies in the machines from the 1960s through the mid-1980s. Classic British bikes like Triumph and BSA continue to battle it out on track against the more modern Japanese multi-cylinder bikes of the 1970s. The competition is fierce, as these machines are finely tuned and as competitive as ever.

Spectator Experience: Access to the Action

Spectators can enjoy an up-close experience, with access to the NASCAR oval, garage areas, and grand-stands. Whether rain or shine, the races will go on, ensuring a weekend full of action-packed racing and the chance to immerse yourself in the history of motorcycle racing. Located on scenic Route 106 in Loudon, NH, New Hampshire Motor Speedway is the place to be during Laconia Bike Week! The action-packed schedule is headlined by the 102nd running of the iconic Loudon Classic on Saturday, June 14th presented by NEMRR (www.nemrr.com), followed by the FIM North America Vintage Road Race Championships on June 21st & 22nd, presented by the USCRA (www.race-

Just a short walk from the south end of the Speedway property is the New England Racing Museum, a must-visit for racing enthusiasts. The museum boasts an impressive collection of racing motorcycles, sidecars, and racecars, as well as New England's largest motorsports library. Among its many treasures are helmets worn by top racers and a massive array of trophies won by New England-based drivers.

One highlight of the museum's collection is a homebuilt drag bike powered by a 405-CID Buick engine, and there's also a BSA Goldstar, famously ridden by Jody Nicholas to victory at the 1963 Laconia National despite an epic last-lap tumble at the old Belknap track. You'll find a one-of-a-kind ROKON "works" flat track bike, one of fewer than ten ever made, and a rare Honda "works" flat tracker, of which only four were produced. Also on display is the TZ500 Yamaha, ridden by the first woman to complete the Daytona 200, and the MSDS 175 Parilla racer, a veteran of two Motogiro d'Italias.

This year, the museum is featuring two exciting new additions: the AMA Laconia National-winning Suzuki ridden by John Bettencourt and a historic BMW racing

sidecar that has been competing since the 1960s and has racked up numerous championships. Every bike and vehicle in the museum has a rich history in New England's racing scene.


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FREE VINTAGE HILL CLIMB AT THE WEIRS — JUNE 17, 2025

Did you know that the original "Laconia" Hill Climb was held on Tower Street, just off Lakeside Avenue in the Weirs? The first hill climb took place in 1916, marking the beginning of the Gypsy Tour and the area's rich racing history. Back then, Tower Street was just a dirt road. Fast forward to today, and Tower Street is paved, but the steep challenge it presents remains just as thrilling—an exciting showcase of motorcycles roaring up the hill.

After 1924, the AMA Sanctioned Hill Climb moved to Gunstock Mountain Resort, where the iconic 70-meter ski jump now hosts modern hill climbs. But on **Tuesday**, **June 17th**, **2025**, the **Vintage Tower Hill Climb** will bring us back to where it all started, at the Weirs.

This exclusive Vintage Hill Climb Exhibition will run from 1pm to 3pm, featuring classic motorcycles from 1916 through the mid-1970s. Hosted by the United States Classic Racing Association (www.race-uscra.com), this event is sure to bring a rush of nostalgia. From the very first machines to more recent vintage bikes, this exhibition will showcase the history of hill climbing in all its glory.

ARCHIVES: THE ORIGINS OF THE LACONIA CLASSIC

The Laconia (NH) Classic was once the second biggest motorcycle race in America, second only to Daytona. The race had origins that pre-dated even Daytona. What's interesting about Laconia, is that unlike Sturgis, which originated as a motorcycle race later to become a much more famous as an annual motorcyclist rally, Laconia actually started as an annual Gypsy Tour dating back to 1917 and was a well-established gathering, years later that spawned a national race.

Motorcycling, which thrived for the first half of the 1910s as a major mode of transportation, began to slip by the mid-decade with Ford's continuous improvements to its mass production techniques and the resultant low-cost Model T. In 1917 America's motorcycle industry body, the Federation of American Motorcyclists (FAM) was looking for ways to stimulate motorcycle ridership and sales and came up with a series of tours they dubbed Gypsy Tours. These tours would take place across the country, but almost immediately the tour held in New England became the biggest. It made sense, in that the bulk of motorcycle makers during the early year of the industry were in New England. Indian, the biggest motorcycle manufacturer in the world at that point, was in Springfield, Massachusetts.

And the Laconia Gypsy Tour had the major population base of Boston and New York City from which to draw. The rally grew rapidly and would hold the honor as the biggest annual gathering of motorcyclists until it was overtaken by Sturgis probably sometime in the 1970s.

Big-time national racing came to the New England Gypsy Tour with the advent of AMA's then new Class C (production based) racing category. Swanzey, New Hampshire hosted AMA 200-Mile TT Nationals starting in 1934. A local hero Babe Tancrede won that first 200-Mile TT National on a Harley-Davidson. Then another local, the relatively unheralded Hanford Marshall won the big TT event in '36. The '36 race was dubbed "The Derby of Death". Racer Richard Ashbrook died when he ran off the course into a tree and a spectator was killed when he was hit attempting to cross the track.

The Swanzey TT course was 3.3 miles long over rough roads, up and down hills and many turns. A newspaper estimated the crowds at the Swanzey TT at 10,000, a massive gathering during the Great Depression.

Old Orchard Beach, Maine, hosted the New England Gypsy Tour in 1937 and a 100-mile National was held. The race was won by Indian-backed rider Lester The start of the Laconia TT National in 1939 before the Belknap Park course was paved.

Hillbish, who actually had to borrow a motorcycle from a spectator at the last minute, when his bike quit running. Hillbish was offered the bike by motorcycle dealer Horace Fritz, from Hillbish's hometown of Reading. PA. Hillbish won the 100-miler, not only having to make an extra stop owing to a stock tank, but it was especially notable since, Fritz had ridden the motorcycle 500 miles to the race! The fans, made aware of Hillbish's situation, went nuts when he took the checkered flag a lap ahead of Ben Campanale, who would go on to win the Daytona 200 in 1938 and '39.

Springfield (MA) Indian Motorcycle Dealer Fritzie Baer was instrumental in bringing the New England Gypsy Tour races to the Belknap Recreational Area in Laconia, New Hampshire. Interestingly Baer later left Indian to become managing director of the park. In that capacity, he promoted the Laconia Classic (now called the Loudon Classic) road races through 1963. In spite of being called the Laconia Classic, the Belknap Park circuit was actually located in neighboring Gilford.

The first national at Belknap in 1938 was a 200-miler won by Daytona winner Iron Man Ed Kretz on an Indian. That gave Kretz several distinctions – he was the first rider to win the what would become known as the Laconia Classic, he was the first rider outside of the Northeastern part of the country to win the national race associated with the New England Gypsy Tour, and finally he was the only 200-mile winner of the Laconia Classic. In 1939 the race at Belknap would become a 100 miler.

With the scenic environment and exciting course at Belknap, the New England Tour had found a permanent home for its big race. The races throughout the years would see improvement to the one-mile course, going from all dirt or gravel, to being paved. It went from being classified a TT national to a road race national in 1940.

The race grew steadily, but then absolutely exploded in popularity after it resumed after World War II. Look at images of the race in the 1940s and '50s and you'll see just massive crowds of fans crowded around the length of the wooded circuit. Word of the race spread and CBS made Laconia one its earliest annual sporting events covered.

Laconia went along fine until the early 1960s when unruly attendees starting drawing strong complaints from local residents. It reached a breaking point and in 1964 the New England Dealer Association announced it could not come to an agreement with local offi-


cials to host the rally and the race.

The answer to renew the race was to build a specially built road course and Bryar Motorsports Park was completed at nearby Loudon in time for the renewal of what would now become the Loudon Classic. Unfortunately, in order to satisfy complaints by locals citizens, local officials went way too heavy handed in '65. They enacted unreasonable local ordinances that basically allowed police to arrest groups of three of more people who were "loitering". In order to enforce these stringent rules with 20,000 motorcyclists, a large group of National Guardsmen were station in place at Weirs Beach setting the stage for over-policing resulting in an outbreak of violence now called the Weir's Beach Riot. Thousands of Laconia attendees threw rocks, burned cars and damaged buildings during night of rioting in this resort area. More than 100 persons were arrested and more than 60 persons were treated at hospitals.

The '65 riots marked a turning point for the rally. It gradually diminished in numbers, though the national races went on at Loudon through 2002. Incidentally, the nighttime partying at the new track became both legendary and infamous with the view from Animal Hill looking like something out of Apocalypse Now on particularly crazy evenings.

The rally continues today and races are still held during Laconia Bike Week, but have been club events now since 2002, but for an amazing stretch from the late 1930s to the early 2000s, the Laconia/Loudon Classic was one of the truly elite motorcycle racing events in America, and attracted massive crowds.





in Meredith gained nationwide attention some 37 years ago when a small group of veterans began holding weekly Thursday night vigils to bring to light the nation's lack of effort to account for all service men and women missing from Vietnam. Through times of basking heat, frigid rainstorms and mid-winter snows, this small group of people held vigils to gain people's attention to the fact that members of our armed forces were unaccounted for and forgotten.

The **Freedom Ride** is slated to begin at 6:00 p.m. on Thursday, June 19, 2025, with line up beginning at 5:00 p.m. at the Route 11 ~ 1407 Lakeshore Road, Gilford, NH 03249 (Lowe's parking). This year looks to break all years in participation as the Northeast POW/MIA Network has joined forces with Blue and Gold Star families of N.H., all veterans and veteran organizations, together with all bikers and biker organizations, followed with the **Northeast POW/MIA Network Vigil**.

The Northeast POW/MIA Network continues to fight for **Capt. Ike Camacho**.

The Green Beret, Ike Camacho issue continues! Why??? Good question! The Northeast POW/MIA Network is getting closer to an answer. As last reported to you, we were working with Military Staffing DC and with Boards who were Vetting Ike?? After more than a year, we learned that was all false! Seems anything to stop this American Hero from receiving the Medal of Honor he was put in for back in 1965 has been done. We recently learned that his records were classified! Imagine that, longer than President Kennedys. Why? Maybe because Ike's military record is more than 2000 pages long. What could be in there?

Captain Ike Camacho, was given the Bronze Star, That's a Bronze Star for being held for 18 months and

The Second Person to escape from a Camp was Nick Rowe a true Hero, received a Silver Star! So, what did the Army have to do? Go back and Update Ike's Bronze to a Silver Star! Why was that held from him in first place? Maybe it would prove an embarrassment that an Mexican/Native American to be first anything, especially Medal of Honor.



A few years ago, Ike's Silver Star was upgraded to the Distinguished Service Cross by George W. Bush. This sounds fine. However, Ike was put up for the Medal of Honor, so why not? Could it have been because they were held by not only North Vietnamese Army but "Cubans". After Ike's escape and his return to the United States, he was debriefed for weeks, in Hawaii.

Would that fact, along with the fact that Ike was Mexican/Native American, have anything to do with him not receiving the Medal of Honor as he was put in for?

So, here we are, 68 years later and an 88-year-old Green Beret still fighting for what is his. Actually, he's not fighting at all. He says," Guys, it's ok! I appreciate everything y'all, especially your Senator Hassan has done



on my behalf and Gracie but if the Good Lord wanted it to happen then it would happen. I was told way back, as a Mexican/Native American, I was never going to see the Medal of Honor no matter how many speak your name, I believed them"!

The Network, along with Senator Hassan's offices, continues working on this matter. With the effort of Sen. Maggie Hassan and her staff we are pleased to announce that Ike's progress has been sent to the Honor Board which is made up of three 1 Star Generals and 1 Ex-POW. From there if positive goes to the Secretary of Defense and then onto the President of the United States. This has been a three-year effort by the advocate of the Northeast POW/MIA Network and all of those who stand the vigils.

For those who have yet to participate in the **Freedom Ride**, the real focus of the ride is to bring into light an issue that affects hundreds of Americans and their families, those men and women missing in action or held prisoner during times of war and/or conflict.

This scenic drive is not for the faint of heart!

The Auto Road road is 7.6 (12.23 km) miles of steep narrow mountain road without guardrails. The average grade is 12%, which is great fun on a motorcycle!

Whatever vehicle you are driving, you will need good brakes, confidence, and courage. If you doubt your transportation, do not attempt this road.

If you make the journey and the weather is good, you could be rewarded with exquisite views of the mountains all around the Presidential range. On your way to the summit, near the top you might encounter fog and overcast skies. Not to worry, though, just head over to the museum and commissary for snacks and some history about the Mt Washington Weather Observatory, where the highest ever wind speed in the world was recorded. If your timing is good, you might catch sight of the Cog Railroad Train, which makes its stop at the top. As you head back down from the summit of Mount Washington (6,288 feet, or 1917 m), the sky might clear to reveal beautiful views of the mountains below you. be sure to stop at the overlooks throughout.

CELEBRATING THE LEGACY WITH THE VFW FOR 125 YEARS

The Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States is a nonprofit veterans service organization comprised of eligible veterans and military service members from the active, guard and reserve forces.

We trace our roots back to 1899 when veterans of the Spanish-American War (1898) and the Philippine Insurrection (1899-1902) founded local organizations to secure rights and benefits for their service. Many arrived home wounded or sick. There was no medical care or veterans' pension for them, and they were left to care for themselves.

In their misery, some of these veterans banded together and formed organizations that would eventually band together and become known as the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States. After chapters were formed in Ohio, Colorado and Pennsylvania, the movement quickly gained momentum. Today, membership stands at more than 1.4 million members of the VFW and its Auxiliary.

Our voice was instrumental in establishing the Veterans Administration, development of the national cemetery system, in the fight for compensation for Vietnam vets exposed to Agent Orange and for veterans diagnosed with Gulf War Syndrome. In 2008, we won a long-fought victory with the passing of a GI Bill for the 21st Century, giving expanded educational benefits to America's active duty service members, and members of the guard and reserves, fighting in Iraq and Afghanistan. We were the driving force behind the Veterans Access and Accountability Act of 2014, and continually fight for improved VA medical centers services for women veterans. The VFW's legislative advocacy efforts were also the driving force behind the passage of the 2019 Blue Water Navy Veteran Act, and the passage of the 2022 Honoring Our PACT Act, which the VFW considers one of the most significant pieces of veterans legislation in history.

Besides helping fund the creation of the Vietnam, Korean War, World War II and Women in Military Service memorials, in 2005 the VFW became the first veterans' organization to contribute to building the new Disabled Veterans for Life Memorial, which opened in November 2010. And in 2015, we became the first supporter of the Desert Storm and Desert Shield Memorial which broke ground in July of 2022.

We have many programs and services that work to support veterans, service members and their families, as well as communities worldwide. Please check out our latest fact sheet or spend some time browsing our site to learn why No One Does More For Veterans.



LIVE FREE & SHARE THE ROAD!

otorcycle Safety is about Sharing the Road: MAs the weather warms this spring, hundreds of thousands of motorcyclists will be on the roads, ready to ride. One way we can reduce traffic fatalities and keep our roads safe is for drivers to understand motorcycle safety challenges such as size and visibility, and riding practices like downshifting and weaving to be able to anticipate and respond to motorcyclists' behavior. Motorcycles are among the smallest and most vulnerable vehicles on the road, putting riders at greater risk of death and serious injury in a crash. In fact, research and state-level data consistently identifies motorists as being at-fault in more than half of all multivehicle motorcycle-involved collisions.

Older Riders: According to the Insurance Institute for Highway Safety, Riders 50 and older made up 36% of all motorcycle fatalities in 2017. So-called "re-entry riders," who rode in their 20s and decided to take it up again in their late 40s to 60s face additional challenges today: more traffic, more powerful bikes, more distracted drivers and diminished physical skills. If you're going to ride a motorcycle, it's important to commit to

BROADCASTING LIVE ALL WEEK FROM WEIRS BEACH a lifetime of learning new skills and brushing up on the old ones.

Protect Yourself and Others: A helmet is the most important equipment a rider can use. In 2018, 75% of motorcyclists in NH were not wearing a helmet.

Helmets are estimated to be 37% effective in preventing fatal injuries.

Here are some more helpful safety tips:

- As a new rider, choose a bike that fits you. Many inexperienced riders tend to choose a motorcycle above their skill level "supersport bikes" have driver death rates about four times that of cruisers or standard bikes, according to the Insurance Institute for Highway Safety.
- New riders should take a motorcycle safety course, and experienced riders should take re-fresher courses after being off their bikes for a while. You can find out more about the New Hampshire Motorcycle Rider Training Program offered through the Division of Motor Vehicles.
- Know the rules of the road.
- Be aware that riding with a passenger requires more skill.
- Never drink and ride.
- Drive defensively, especially at intersections, where half of all collisions occur.
- Watch for hazards on the roads.
- Assume you are invisible to other motorists and position yourself to be seen.
- Use headlights day and night
- Be courteous; don't weave in and out of lanes, or ride on the shoulder or between lanes.
- Don't speed.
- Wear bright and/or reflective clothing that is durable and boots that cover the ankles.
- Wear goggles, glasses or use a face shield that's ventilated to prevent fogging, make sure it's clear if riding at night.

NEW HAMPSHIRE MOTORCYCLE LAWS & HAND SIGNALS

- Helmets are required under age 18.
- Protective eye cover required unless you have a full windshield.
- Mufflers and baffles required. Decibel below 100.
- Modification of stock exhaust system to increase noise level is a violation of the law.
- Burnouts or wheel stands are not allowed on any public highway.
- Passing another vehicle in the same lane is a violation.
- There must be a seat and footrests for a passenger.
- Every motorcycle must have a rear view mirror.
- NH open container law will be strongly enforced.
- Walking in the road and interfering with motorcycle traffic is not allowed.





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

The City of Sturgis Motorcycle Rally

Tt's been called the "Black Hills Motor Classic," ▲ "Sturgis Rally & Races," "The Rally" and even "The Granddaddy of 'em all," but most know it simply as "Sturgis."

This is more than any event; it's a pilgrimage for motorcycle riders and fans from around the globe. They gather with like-minded individuals for a week of awe-inspiring activities, scenic rides, and a stroll down legendary Main Street Sturgis.

Those who journey to Sturgis, whether for the first time or the 50th, share a common spirit. They are passionate about gathering in a location with those who love the adrenaline-pumping experience of leaning into a curve in Vancocker Canyon and catching a glimpse of Mount Rushmore between the aspen along Iron Mountain Road.

The Sturgis Rally is a family reunion of sorts for many who come to the town of 7,000 in the Black Hills of South Dakota. They meet old friends at familiar locations and forge new friendships as well.

The Rally has changed over the years, but the core of the Rally spirit hasn't, said Sturgis Mayor Kevin Forrester who grew up in Sturgis and understands why riders come back year after year.

"The backdrop of the rally in the beautiful Black Hills which opens up a world of unparalleled motorcycle riding," Forrester said. "Iconic routes like the Needles Highway, Iron Mountain Road, and the Wildlife Loop present riders with breathtaking views and exhilarating experiences."

The City of Sturgis' heritage runs deep. It was founded as an old Cavalry outpost in 1878, and as of last year, the Rally celebrated 84 years of helping riders (of



"steel horses" in modern times) uncover, revisit and participate in the thrills of the Sturgis and the Rally experience.

The event that is the City of Sturgis Motorcycle Rally began in 1938, when Clarence "Pappy" Hoel, his wife, Pearl, and his newly founded Jackpine Gypsies Motorcycle Club decided to host a race in Sturgis. Nine participants and a mere 200 spectators attended.

Today the City of Sturgis Motorcycle Rally is one of, if not "the" largest gatherings of motorcycle enthusiasts in the world. The 2025 City of Sturgis Motorcycle Rally, Aug. 1-10, celebrates the 85th Anniversary of the event that has become known to motorcycle enthusiasts throughout the world.

Two-wheelers travel from around the globe to enjoy rock concerts, motorcycle racing, hill climbs, and scenic highways.

Again, this year, the American Flat Track will host a race through the streets of downtown Sturgis on Sunday, Aug. 10. In addition, the AFT plans races at the historic Jackpine Gypsies short track on Monday and Tuesday, Aug. 4 and 5 which will feature classes for Adventure Trackers, Mission SuperTwins and Parts Unlimited AFT Singles.

Rally attendance hovers around a half a million with participants from all 50 states as well as Canada and dozens of other international communities including Japan, Australia, Germany, and England.

If you haven't been to the City of Sturgis Motorcycle Rally, you simply must come experience it, Forrester said.

"Those who attend soon realize that they want to make plans to return," he said.

The staff are actively preserving the Legacy of Motorcycling and celebrating the legends of the Freedom Fighters, Industry giants, motorcycling veterans and racing legends through the Sturgis Motorcycle Hall of Fame. Last year the induction breakfast introduced greats including Pete and Jackie Hill, James Gregory, Roger Goldammer, Ed Kerr, Christine and Bob LePera, Bud Ekins, Jiggs Cressy and David Uhl. The presence of the governor of South Dakota, Kristi Noem





helped make the event top of the line. Museum staff through high technology made it state of the art.

Last year the board of directors expanded with active Hall of Fame members. The first Giving Tuesday Fund Raising Program sparkled. The staff and board members created a kick-ass Sturgis Rally Magazine. They added new exhibits including a giant Michael Lichter photographic display and a massive timeline to allow spectators to check the history at a glance.

Over 80 antique, flat track, Bonneville record holding bikes adorn the historic decks. A fantastic array of Art from many of the motorcycling greats glow from the walls including Eric Herrmann, Scott Jacobs, David Uhl and we're proud to be working with another master Danial James who designed T-shirt art for H-D, Indian and Triumph.

Make a point to stop by. Learn, experience, smell and feel the history of the Sturgis Motorcycle Rally, twowheeled memoires and the folks behind the legends. Parking at the following locations is typically \$10/bike and car parking may also be available.

- Endicott Park: This is the lot right at the beach. The Weirs Action Committee is a non-profit organization, and the parking lot is their biggest fundraiser of the year. Net proceeds are for the beautification and benefit of Weirs Beach.
- Weirs Beach Community Park Association: This lot is located behind the Weirs Beach Fire Station on Lucern Avenue and is an easy walk to Lakeside Avenue.
- Foster Avenue: This lot is at the corner of the street and is run by a trusted Motorcycle Week business owner and resident.







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HOW TO AVOID ANIMAL COLLISIONS ON THE ROADS

As you enjoy the scenic views that New Hampshire has to offer This motorcycle season, keep in mind that wildlife can pop up when you least expect it. Here are some useful tips to avoid animal encounters of the third kind!



- One important way to avoid messy encounters is to never drive drunk or high. Be sure to lock up and the leave the bike, or call a cab or a friend for a ride home. Don't let your friends ride drunk. Remember, Ride Sober or Get Pulled Over.
- Always use an aggressive visual search pattern when riding. By looking far and near and side to side you will see animals and other roadway users before they enter your path of travel. This will give you time to avoid collision in a more controlled manner.
- Deer are not solitary animals, they travel with their herd. Slow down if you see a deer. It's likely there are more close behind.
- Don't challenge large animals it's a safer bet to turn around and seek an alternative route if possible.
- Always slow down and use your high beams in all animal crossing areas.
- If you often ride the roads at night, invest in powerful headlights.
- Do not override your headlight. At higher speeds, it can take more distance to stop than your headlight reaches. By the time you see something in your path it is already too late. Slow down at night!
- If you're riding in a group spread out. If there's a collision, it will prevent one rider from taking out the whole group.
- As always, don't forget to wear protective gear you never know who or what you will encounter on the open road.
- Take training that will assist you in honing skills needed when that animal encounter does happen.

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
